

A converted mirror factory hits the market in Paris for €2.5 million

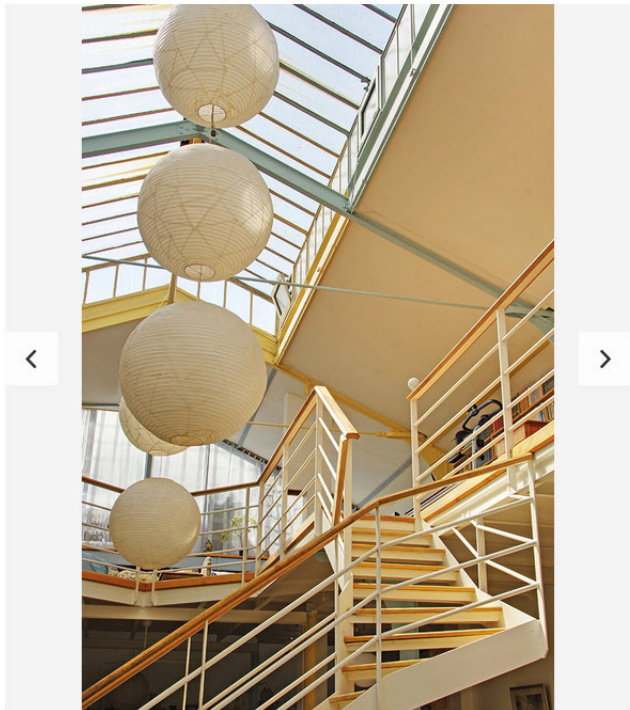

This converted mirror factory - [on the market for €2.5 million via Patrice Besse](#) - could be just the place to be seen in Paris.

Sited in the city's 11th arrondissement, the 392 sq m [property](#) lies beside a private courtyard on Avenue Philippe Auguste near the Place de la Nation.

It retains many hallmarks of the capital's [industrial architecture](#), including wood and metal balcony corridors and industrial windows. There's also plenty of potential to play about with its layout: organised around a central courtyard planted with bamboo and olive trees, the property has eight rooms and could be easily reconfigured as a live/work space.

One thing it definitely isn't short of is natural light, thanks to the factory's original glass roofing. There's also a private terrace on the top floor, connected by a kitchen.
