

7 spectacular Paris apartments for sale right now

Former art studios and an architect's retreat

Ever since the Brexit vote, Paris has been enjoying a resurgence as one of the European property market's hottest spots. But flush as the city is with architectural treasures and literary heritage, it's not like anyone needs an excuse to move to the French capital. As Audrey Hepburn once said, Paris is always a good idea. With that in mind, we've rounded up the seven most spectacular Paris apartments for sale today, from a sprawling artist's haven in the Marais, to a bijou Art Deco bolthole overlooking the Eiffel Tower.

A mansion flat on Île Saint-Louis

1 bedroom

Unsurprisingly for an island in the middle of the Seine, Île Saint-Louis is one of Paris' most prestigious addresses. This L-shaped, one-bedroom apartment in an 17th-century mansion block offers a respite from the frenetic pace of the city beyond; the interiors newly renovated to balance period details with contemporary touches.

An Art Deco home in the 7th

This apartment sits on the first floor of an elaborate 1932 building that wears its heritage

proudly. Delicate wrought iron balconies on the façade and stained glass in the entrance hall declare the Art Deco style, which is continued inside the apartment with original herringbone parquet floors and elegantly arched oak doors. Painter and sculptor François Arnal once lived in this studio-complex-cum-flat in Arcueil, which offers both a peaceful retreat and easy access to the capital. Dubbed 'Atelier A', the buildings span 680 sq m, and are set in grounds spanning more than 820 sq m. At the heart is a vast

kitchen and bedrooms, and an unusual bamboo garden.
